The Original Rotary Club was organized in Chicago, Illinois by Paul Harris, a lawyer. The first meeting was February 23, 1905. The name "Rotary" was chosen because the club met in rotation in each member's place of business. The Rotary idea of friendship, fellowship, and service to others has spread to over 1.4 million members world wide in 46,000 clubs. The Yucaipa Rotary Club was chartered on June 15, 1956. Rotary International formed the Rotary Foundation. You have the opportunity, as a member, to donate to the Foundation. Once your cumulative donations have reached \$1,000, you become a Paul Harris Fellow.

Yucaipa Christmas Parade:



The parade was started 63 years ago by the Churches of Yucaipa. They ran the parade for two years, then turned it over to the Yucaipa Lions Club for 61 years with the Yucaipa Rotary Club and Co-sponsor The City of Yucaipa taking it on in 2018 for the people of Yucaipa and Calimesa.

The parade is always the second Saturday of December at 12 noon.
